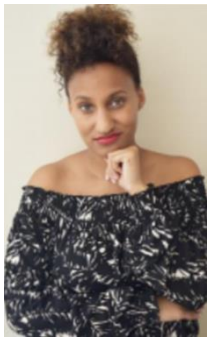


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**Dr. Fereidoon Parsioon, MD**

Born in Iran, Dr. Fereidoon Parsioon bought books with his weekly allowance, and upon reading studies of the brain at age 15, decided that he would be a neurosurgeon in the United States. Dr. Parsioon received his M.D. from Pahlavi University School of Medicine in a program based on American medicine and completed a neurosurgery exchange program through Dr. J.T. Robertson of the University of Texas Health Science Center. Dr. Parsioon moved to Memphis, Tennessee where he completed residencies in surgery and neurosurgery at the University of Tennessee, Memphis. He was affiliated with the Canacle Clinic and Semmes----- Murphey Clinical until he started his own practice, Phoenix Neurosurgery.



**Dr. Akilah Cadet, MPH**

Dr. Akilah Cadet has 15 years in management and building successful projects, teams, and leaders. She has worked on federal, state, and privately funded multimillion-dollar projects ranging from public health/healthcare to education. She has spent an extensive part of her career designing training, coaching executives, and informing systematic change to improve the workforce experience for large organizations like Alameda Health System and the San Francisco Department of Public Health. As a consultant she has worked in corporate cultures and advises tech startups from concept to staffing. Dr. Cadet is also the founder of Change Cadet, a consulting firm that aims to support underserved communities and current/future leaders of color through coaching and innovation as well as strategically support organizations through changes needed to be more diverse and improve overall success. As a woman of color, she uses her personal and professional experiences to inspire her work. She is the recipient of the American Public Health Association's 2014 Health Administration Rising Star Award and holds a Bachelor of Science in Health Education in Community Based Public Health, a Master of Public Health, and a Doctorate of Health Sciences in Leadership and Organizational Behavior.



**Dr. David Elkin, MD, MSL**

David Elkin, MD, MSL completed medical school at the University of Pennsylvania, an Internal Medicine and Psychiatry residency at UC Davis before joining the staff of the Consultation Liaison Service at San Francisco General Hospital in 1989. He is a Clinical Professor of Psychiatry at UC San Francisco. David is the department's coordinator for medical students in their clinical rotations. He leads seminars for medical students and residents on topics including psychiatric assessment, critical thinking, and the medical humanities. His academic interests include education, medical ethics, and the overlap between medicine, literature and the arts. David is the editor of the Lange series textbook Introduction to Psychiatry for Medical Students (Lange, 1999), and an upcoming book chapter on medical ethics. When he's not working, he's reading, baking, or riding a mountain bike in the Oakland Hills, where he lives with his family.



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
